major event is set to be held in Bordeaux in October 2025. We are immensely proud of being the host city for the seventh Global Social and Solidarity Economy Forum, and as mayor, I am not only proud but also extremely hopeful, because there is every reason to believe that in economic terms, the twenty-first century will either be SSE or won't be, to paraphrase a famous quote by Malraux.

That is my deep, personal conviction, and it is ours, collectively. Back in 2021, the Nouvelle-Aquitaine Region, the Department of Gironde, Bordeaux Métropole and the City of Bordeaux decided to move forward hand in hand in support of the Social and Solidarity Economy, to encourage innovation and collective approaches while raising awareness among new audiences, and to facilitate access to land for committed businesses. This is a rare and exemplary situation.

The consequences of this joint commitment are very tangible, and the figures are eminently encouraging. In the municipality of Bordeaux alone, where there are almost 1,500 establishments – half of the city's SSE organisations – the number of employees has increased by more than 20% in the last ten years.

We have managed to turn our regions into testing grounds, inventing new relationships and creating virtuous economies that promote the principles of solidarity and social utility. We are proving by example that municipalities and other local authorities have a central role to play, thanks to their proximity to citizens.

In 2022, I travelled to the UN headquarters in New York to represent local government bodies and business networks in support of the need for a reference text on the SSE. Such a resolution was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on 18 April 2023. This was an important milestone, which we celebrated at the Dakar Forum held during the following month. The Bordeaux 2025 Forum will be an opportunity to take another step in what is nothing short of a revolution.

Global SSE Forum Bordeaux GSEF 2025

In the autumn of 2025, the Global Social and Solidarity Economy Forum will be held for the first time in France, following previous events held in Seoul, Montreal, Bilbao, Mexico City and Dakar. This major biennial international event brings together all the stakeholders in the Social and Solidarity Economy ecosystem.

The objective?

Pooling the visions and practices that can make the SSE the "standard that will regulate the economy of tomorrow", imposing the primacy of people and collective projects over capital and structuring an economy of proximity and the long term perspectives.

- bring together elected representatives and leaders from all over the world, along with international experts, development agencies, networks and stakeholders in the field who are committed to promoting economic models centred on people while respecting the environment. A final declaration sets out the political commitments and a roadmap for the next two years;
- encourage exchanges of experience and expertise implemented on all continents. The dense programme, coconstructed with the Scientific Committee and the contributions received, will reflect initiatives led by players committed to the SSE, using formats that encourage perspective and cross-fertilisation.

The Global SSE Forum 2025 is a key event on the road to achieving the sustainable development goals. With 5 years to go before the 2030 Agenda, it will bring together civil society and

local and regional authorities to get things moving, challenge decision-makers and speed up the just transition.

This meeting is also part of a dense and decisive global sequence, just a few days before the World Social Forum in Doha (4-6 November 2025), which will bring together heads of state and government to accelerate the implementation of a new global social contract based on the reduction of poverty.

In this context, Bordeaux GSEF 2025 will be a powerful reminder of the key role played by local governments and civil society in building sustainable, inclusive development rooted in the territories. This is a strategic moment to share concrete solutions, strengthen cooperation and make the voice of local players heard on a global scale. This is all the more crucial given the many threats facing the world today: wars, authoritarian regimes, economic disorder, hardening social relations, ecological disasters, disinformation, etc. The SSE is witnessing a new narrative that it is up to us all to write.

In addition to the central site of the event, the Forum will extend over time and space, with a suggested tour route on the eve of the opening to enable visitors to get to know the SSE in their local area, as well as highlighting the SSE for the general public and mobilizing hundreds of young people to make their voices heard and give voice to their initiatives.

Open to the city, Bordeaux GSEF 2025 will be an opportunity to showcase the SSE in what it is and could be even more, present in everyone's daily life, serving the common good. Fertile gateways will also be offered to conventional economic players to promote responsible cooperation rooted locally.




The formats offered


4 themed plenary sessions featuring leading personalities, invited to discuss the major issues of the day for those who make the SSE work.

The SSE Youth dynamic



Since its creation in 2013, the GSEF has always recognized the importance of mobilizing young people in the Social Solidarity Economy (SSE). Through international events, committed advocacy and structured continental dynamics, the GSEF highlights the central role of young people in social, economic and environmental transitions.

SSE Youth Hub

At the General Assembly of the GSEF2023 in Dakar, the creation of the SSE Youth Hub was voted to recognize young people as key players in changing the scale of the SSE.

It has three main areas of activity:

- Sensitization: promoting the values of the SSE among young people;
- Advocacy: enhancing the role of young people as actors in just transitions;
- Support: supporting young people's projects via platforms, incubators and cooperatives.

The SSE Youth Hub is based on a decentralized approach with five complementary continental dynamics, driven by continental co-pilots and regular meetings.

Towards a youth advocacy

The momentum is well underway, with the aim of mobilizing, promoting and making heard the voices of young people committed to fair social, economic and ecological transitions.

As part of this, a youth campaign is being rolled out to gather the views and recommendations of young people in order to build a case for each continent.

During the Forum, a workshop will be organized to bring together these continental pleas in the form of an 'International Youth Declaration for the SSE', which will be presented to all the participants at the event's closing ceremony.



Young people at the forum

Delegations of young ambassadors are expected to attend the Forum and will be supported by a number of partners.













Located in the heart of the Bacalan district of Bordeaux, on the former site of the Beghin Say sugar refineries, the Achard business park has become the **Cité Bleue** thanks to the new impetus given by the owners.

This hybrid, committed site will host the **Young SSE Hub** during the Forum.

This complementary programme at the Palais 2 l'Atlantique is built around 10 themed activities that are accessible free of charge.

More than 50 activities from Monday to Friday based on 10 themes:

- Culture & Music (e.g. promoting interculturality)
- **Sport** (e.g. international tournament to share values)
- Media (e.g. Talking SSE, by and for young people)
- · Games (e.g. SSE Olympics to raise awareness of issues)
- **Cinema** (e.g. screening of socially responsible documentaries)
- Itinerancy (e.g. inspiring/learning visit)
- Young people's mettings (comparing the views of different nationalities)
- Meetings between professionals and young people
- **Meetings between professionals** (combining the pedagogies of youth workers)
- Advocacy (Continental approaches: converging towards a joint declaration)

An international mixed football tournament will be organized to build bridges between young people from near and far.

On the last evening of the Forum, there will be a big party, free and open to all.

Territorial pathways



On the eve of the Bordeaux GSEF 2025 World SSE Forum, the Région Nouvelle-Aquitaine, the Département de la Gironde and the CRESS Nouvelle-Aquitaine are offering 9 routes to discover the dynamics and local initiatives of the Social Solidarity Economy.


4 pathways will take place in **Gironde** - Médoc, Bassin d'Arcachon & Val de Leyre, Libournais and Sud-Gironde - and 5 others in neighbouring departments, in **Charente**, **Charente**-**Maritime**, **Dordogne**, **Lot-et-Garonne** and **Landes**.

Each itinerary will invite participants to immerse themselves at the heart of innovative and meaningful projects, embodying the values of cooperation, solidarity and sustainable local development. Around 1,000 people have been and will be involved in these visits, including many local authorities, nearly 150 SSE players and, in Gironde, the support of the SSE Hub and the Collectif Marées.

This is a unique opportunity for participants to gain a better understanding of the diversity of SSE ecosystems, to draw inspiration from them and to share their own experiences.

The routes will also be an opportunity to offer a unique opportunity to discover the countryside, heritage and local specialities throughout the day.

Global organization of local governments and civil society networks for Social and Solidarity Economy



An international organisation ...

The GSEF (Global Forum for Social and Solidarity Economy) is an international organisation of local governments and civil society networks committed to promoting the social and solidarity economy (SSE) as a means of achieving inclusive and sustainable local development.

Created in 2013, the GSEF differs from existing international SSE initiatives and networks. The emphasis on the role of local government clearly affirms their crucial role in the governance and resolution of the major challenges of the twenty-first century, from climate change to social cohesion and inequalities.

The GSEF is convinced that systemic changes begin at the local level, underpinned by a partnership between civil society and public and private stakeholders, with the aim of ramping up the SSE to set the standard for tomorrow's economy, by integrating the collective management of common goods.

The GSEF promotes various forms of SSE, including social enterprises, cooperatives, foundations, mutual societies and self-help groups, which put people before profit.

In addition to its biennial SSE forum, which has become one of the largest international gatherings, the GSEF operates in five key areas:



Capacity building for local governments (co-construction of SSE public policies)



Exchanges of experience and practices



Research and publication



Creation and support for local and national SSE networks



(International advocacy for international recognition of the SSE

The GSEF has a significant capacity for convergence, through its many partnerships and closer collaborations, in addition to a capacity for action.

The GSEF cooperates with international networks, which are also members. This collective approach facilitates collaborative actions in line with priorities in order to promote the SSE and, with it, a change in development models.

Through its advocacy activities, the GSEF has made a major contribution to the international recognition of the SSE by the most multilateral institutions, building up momentum which culminated in 2022-2023 with the OECD Recommendation, the universal definition of the International Labour Conference (ILC), and the Resolution of 18 April 2023 adopted by the United Nations General Assembly.

... with strong local roots

In October 2021, the GSEF General Assembly selected Bordeaux as the host city for the headquarters of its Standing Secretariat, previously based in Seoul, South Korea.

The city's bid was supported by four partner local authorities: the City of Bordeaux, Bordeaux Métropole, the Department of Gironde and the Nouvelle-Aquitaine Region, in association with the Nouvelle-Aquitaine Regional Chamber for the Social and Solidarity Economy (CRESS) representing stakeholders and stakeholder networks.

The GSEF is chaired by Pierre Hurmic, Mayor of Bordeaux (Vice-President of Bordeaux Métropole) and co-chaired by Stéphane Montuzet, President of CRESS Nouvelle-Aquitaine. Since the introduction of continental co-presidencies in 2021, the Nouvelle-Aquitaine Region has carried out this mandate for Europe (vice-presidency: Departmental Council of Gironde).

In 10 years, the GSEF has become a recognised global network, demonstrating its ability to mobilise a wide range of players from every continent. This is illustrated by the success of the last six GSEF Global Forums (Seoul, Montreal, Bilbao, Mexico and Dakar). The GSEF entrusts the organisation of this major event to a host city on a biennial basis. Bordeaux GSEF 2025 represents the seventh edition of the Global SSE Forum.



Focus on ...

DakarGSEF2023

Dakar hosted the 2023 edition of the GSEF Global SSE Forum, co-organised by the City of Dakar, RACTES, the GSEF and the Senegalese Ministry of Microfinance and SSE. This six-day event featured a GSEF Forum preceded by two pre-forum events: "Jeun'ESS" focusing on youth, and "Femm'ESS" focusing on women. The event was very well attended, with a large number of participants from Senegal and West Africa. This edition culminated in the reading of the Dakar Declaration at the closing plenary session.
