
























- Since its creation in 2013, the GSEF has always recognized the importance of youth engagement in the Social and Solidarity Economy (SSE).

 Through international events, committed advocacy and structured continental dynamics, the GSEF highlights the central role of young people in social, economic and environmental transitions.
- The Youth Hub is located in the heart of Bordeaux's Bacalan district, on the former site of the Beghin Say sugar refineries.

 Beyond this site, young people are of course present throughout the Forum, notably at Hangar 14 for activities aimed at the general public, but also at Palais 2 l'Atlantique, where youth delegations will host radio programmes and present the International Youth Declaration at the close of the Forum.
- Conversely, Forum participants can discover this complementary programme at Palais 2 l'Atlantique, with interactive workshops, cultural events and social spaces.



Developing a Social and Solidarity Economy in a context of transition requires identifying the ecological and social contributions made by organizations and their stakeholders. What if revealing and strengthening these contributions also required a sensitive approach? What if a symbol was worth as much, if not more, than words?
